## BUILD

## PRAY

## FIND

This week's verse comes from the psalms. Look for it in the book of Psalms together. What book comes before it? What book comes after it?

## TASTE

Read Psalm 19:7-11 out loud to your children and give each of your children a taste of honey. Explain that God's Word to us is precious, sweet and more costly than gold.

Memorize Psalm 119:103. When you use honey in the future, recite the verse as a family.

## CREATE

Encourage each family member to select one verse from Psalm 19:7-11 to incorporate into a piece of art. You may try hand lettering the verse, illustrating it with watercolors or markers, or even writing it onto an appropriate coloring page for younger children. Share your art with each other and explain why the verse you picked is precious to you.
