# WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE THING ABOUT EASTER?

It's easy to think about candy flavors or Easter egg

hunts, but Easter has a far greater meaning. Easter reminds us of the chosen Savior, Jesus.

Jesus's arrival on Earth changed the world forever. A week before His death, people celebrated Him while He rode through the streets on a donkey. But the night before His death, His disciples followed him to a garden where He prayed. Jesus knew something terrible was about to happen.

Jesus, the perfect Son of God, knew He would soon die on the cross. This was a horrible way to die. Most people would have done anything to escape this fate; but Jesus told His Father, *"not my will, but Yours, be done."* (Luke 22:42)

Every step that brought Jesus closer to death brought us closer to life. Jesus could do what no one else could: pay for our sins and offer us eternal life.

Our sinless Savior died in our place, but the story of Jesus doesn't end on the cross. If it had, we would have no reason to celebrate Easter. Thankfully, Jesus' story was far from over.

## Take a moment to learn more about Jesus' death and resurrection. Read Luke 23:32-46 and Luke 24:1-9.

Three days after Jesus died and was buried, two women visited Jesus' tomb. When they reached it, the ground shook from an earthquake! An angel, wearing clothes white as snow, appeared like a flash of lightning! He rolled a heavy boulder away from the tomb's entrance, but Jesus' body was not there. Then the angel said these words: *"Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said."* (Matthew 28:5-6)


What would you think after hearing the news that Jesus was alive? Imagine their excitement when people heard Jesus rose from the dead! **Jesus, God's chosen Savior, defeated sin and death!** 

Jesus came from Abraham's family, was a descendant of King David and was preached about by the chosen messenger, John the Baptist. He made salvation from sin available to ANYONE who believes.

He is the King worthy of all our praise, the Messiah promised from ancient times, the perfect sacrifice to save us from our sins: Jesus Christ.







## FIND IT IN THE BIBLE:

This week's story comes from the book of Luke. Luke is the third of four books known as the Gospels. The author of this book is a man named Luke, a physician. It was written so all would know that Jesus came to seek and to save the lost.

#### HOW CAN I ACCEPT JESUS'S GIFT OF SALVATION?

The Bible is very clear on this. All you have to do is believe. **Acts 16:31** says: "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved. ..." Believe Jesus died and rose again to pay the penalty for the sins you committed. Accept Him as your Savior. Know only He can forgive your sins. It's not about what we can do; it's about what Jesus already did.

### **OT-NT CONNECTION**

When Jesus rose from the dead and visited the disciples, they thought He was a ghost! But the Old Testament promised a chosen Savior of the world, and Jesus showed the disciples He was that Savior! **Read Luke 24:44-47.** 

- What is one Old Testament reference Jesus made in these verses?
- Why are you thankful Jesus made salvation available to ANYONE who believes?

### JOURNAL

In your journal or a notebook, create a timeline of the events that took place between Palm Sunday and Jesus rising from the grave. Write down some of these events on dyed Easter eggs.

Ask an adult if they can hide the eggs around your house or yard for you to find. Once they are all found, help your family arrange the eggs in the order the events occurred.

#### WHY WOULD JESUS CHOOSE TO DIE FOR MY SINS WHEN HE HAD NEVER SINNED?

Jesus knew He was the only One who could save humanity from the curse of sin. He lived a perfect, sinless life; submitted Himself to God the Father's will; and chose to sacrifice Himself to save us from sin. (Luke 22:42) This is a love so great we humans struggle to understand it. John 15:9 says Jesus loves us just like God the Father loves Him.



Spend some time in God's Word this Easter. Read all of **Luke 23 and 24** to learn more about the death and resurrection of the Savior of the world, Jesus.

## CRAFT

The cross was originally a symbol of death, but Jesus defeated the cross when He rose from the dead!

Gather:

- Paper plate
- Glue
- Pencil
- Dried rice or macaroni
- noodles • Cinnamon

Outline a cross on a paper plate. Help your child fill the cross by gluing dried rice or macaroni noodles inside the outline. Once it's dry, drizzle glue on the cross and sprinkle cinnamon on the glue to color it brown like wood.



Help your child look up a recipe to make Resurrection Rolls. These yummy rolls start with a marshmallow in the center that disappears when they are baked! They remind us of how Jesus did not stay dead in His tomb; He rose from the grave!
