GOVERNANCE

- 1 Does your church maintain biblical value statements regarding the dignity and value of children?
- 2 Does your church require all employees and volunteers to abide by a code of conduct?
- **3** Does your church maintain an internal complaint policy?

CHILD SAFETY OPERATIONS

- 4 Does your church control access to children's areas?
- 5 Does your church have specific child safety policies for special events, such as overnight events, home/small groups or events that are open to the public?
- 6 Does your church communicate its child safety program to parents?

SCREENING

- **7** Does your church screen all employees and volunteers, including background checks for adults?
- 8 Does your church interview and require reference checks for all employees and volunteers?
- **9** Does your church maintain a Zero Tolerance Policy for convicted sex offenders?

TRAINING

- **10** Does your church require training for all employees and volunteers on topics related to child safety?
- 11 Does your church require training for all employees and volunteers on child abuse reporting?
- **12** Does your church require all employees and volunteers are trained regarding communicating with children outside of ministry contexts?

RESPONSE

- **13** Does your church have a written response plan to use in the event of a report of child abuse? Does the plan address child safety, receiving disclosures, how to report abuse and mandated reporting laws?
- **14** Does your church have policies related to notifying authorities, legal counsel and the parents of alleged victims?
- **15** Is your church prepared to comply with investigations from authorities if abuse is reported?
