In the Bible, Jesus warned His followers to not make the things they could see, touch and feel the most important things in their lives. He knew those things are temporary and would not last.

Let's see what lesus said to His disciples. Can you help me find Matthew 6, verse 19? The book of Matthew is in the New Testament.

WHAT DO YOU THINK THE TREASURE IS THAT JESUS IS TALKING ABOUT?

A treasure is something valuable or very important to someone. Jesus said the treasure we gather here on Earth is temporary. The things we have won't last forever. Can you think of a treasure you have that will not last forever?

As adults, we often treasure money and work to get more and more. When we are younger, we may want more things, the newest toy or game, the trendiest clothes or the most friends.

Whether we treasure a toy or money or clothes, they are all temporary. The status we think we have on social media will not go on forever. The money we earn will one day run out. The toys we own will break, or we'll get bored with them.

Getting more things and making more money will not make us happier. The world tells us we need the newest toy, more followers, the latest upgrade and definitely more money. But God has a better plan that will bring us much more joy.

So what is God's plan? What should we do instead of working hard to collect more and more stuff? Let's read what Jesus said in the next verse, Matthew 6:20.

"BUT LAY UP FOR YOURSELVES TREASURES IN HEAVEN, WHERE NEITHER MOTH NOR RUST DESTROYS AND WHERE THIEVES DO NOT BREAK IN AND STEAL.*

MATTHEW 6:20

When we lay up for ourselves treasure on Earth, we miss the treasure God has for

us. God wants us to focus on the things that are eternal, the things that last forever and will never be destroyed. Those are the things that will bring us real, lasting joy.

What can we treasure more than the things we own or the money we spend?

We can treasure people. People are made in God's image, and we can use our time and money to serve and love them well. We can pray for them, love them and find ways to serve them. We can also treasure God's Word. We can spend time learning God's

Word at church or at home, and reading it so we can learn more about Him! When we invest in those things, our treasure is in heaven and we are rich in God.

FIND IT IN THE BIBLE: MATTHEW

This week's story comes from the book of Matthew. Matthew is the first of four books known as the Gospels. The author of this book is likely Matthew, the tax collector who became a follower of lesus.

The book of Matthew gives readers a perspective on the life of Jesus and confirms Him as the Messiah.

OT-NT CONNECTION

2 Chronicles 9:22 tells us King Solomon had more wealth than any other king. God also made Solomon the wisest man of his time. In the book of Ecclesiastes Solomon wrote that everything apart from God is meaningless. Money, things, achievement, pleasure — none of it matters unless God is in it. Solomon concluded the book writing, Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. (Ecclesiastes 12:13)

CAN'T I WAIT UNTIL I AM AN ADULT TO WORRY ABOUT WHAT I TREASURE?

Jesus doesn't want you to wait until you are grown to take what He said seriously. The two things that last forever are people and God's Word. You can treasure those no matter how old you are! You can be a child, but be rich in God! How can you treasure your friends and family more this week? Can you spend some time reading God's Word every day?

HOW DO I FIGURE OUT THE THINGS I TREASURE MOST?

Ask yourself these questions:

- What do I spend most of my time doing?
- What do I want to spend all of my money on?
- What do I worry about losing?
- What consumes my thoughts when I am daydreaming?

Are there things in your life you value more than you should? Do you notice yourself caring more about your stuff than about people and the truth in God's Word? Write a prayer and ask God to help you treasure the things that last forever more than the stuff that may be gone tomorrow.

PIGGY BANKS



Make a piggy bank out of a shoebox or jar. Let your child decorate it using stickers or paint. Brainstorm with your child and come up with a list of the things God wants us to treasure. Write each of those things on its own piece of paper. Gather all of the papers and one by one put them in the piggy bank. As you do, read and pray for each of those things together.

DISAPPEARING FOOTPRINTS



Go outside on a sunny day. Along with your child, step in a puddle or on a wet towel and make footprints on the sidewalk or in your driveway. Watch the footprints disappear. Ask your child what things in their life will last forever and never disappear. Remind your child those are the things we should treasure.
