We'll make stops in Nepal, Ukraine, Zimbabwe and Mexico, exploring a different country each week of Advent.
- For your travel enjoyment, you'll also receive a family conversation guide that discusses the weekly Scripture passage, pointing your family to Jesus: the Light of the World.
- Once you arrive at your destination, you'll find seven activity ideas to discover more about each country. The itinerary is up to you and your family; complete as many activities as you want! Choose from recipes to make, songs to sing, interesting facts to discover and a video interview with someone living in the country.
- Want to explore more?
 - Use Google Translate to see what common phrases sound like in Nepal, Ukraine, Zimbabwe and Mexico.
 - Locate each country on a map or globe and spend time learning about its people and places.




